1. Start at the Welcome Center, located within the Gardner Commons Building (GC) GC is home to the Hinckley Institute of Politics and the College of Social and Behavioral Science, as well as many intro-level courses. Gardner Commons also boasts unique dining options like a rotation of favorite SLC restaurants, and a completely plant based food station (Rooted).

2. J. Willard Marriott Library

You have just walked through Library Plaza, which is home to many social events and tasty food trucks. Now, you are on the 3rd floor of our library. The third floor includes: a group study area, a silent study area, and the Reserve Desk. At the Reserve Desk you can check out many textbooks and even skeletons to help you study!

Now walk down to the second floor. Here we have a computer lab, 3-D printing lab, study rooms, and Knowledge Commons. Knowledge Commons allows students to check-out various electronics and offers tech help.
